## RONA GREEN - CHAMPAGNE TASTE AND LEMONADE POCKETS

Rona Green is an artist renowned for her distinct prints and paintings of anthropomorphic characters. This exhibition presents a menagerie of identities drawn from the last decade of Green's printmaking practice. Uncannily familiar and adorned with the tattoos and uniforms of archetypal gangsters, urban legends and quintessential 'Aussies', Green has forged a fantastical world where dogs postulate as stand over men, cats are villainous masterminds and rabbits become fierce cyber warriors. Funny, charming and habitually disturbing, Green's work challenges social and cultural constructs in a language gleaned from suburbia, science fiction and secret societies.

Since graduating from La Trobe University in Bendigo in 1995, Green has established herself as one of Australia's most recognisable artists - defined by a refined aesthetic of bold lines and vibrant blocks of colour. Green has received numerous awards for printmaking including the prestigious Silk Cut Award Grand Prize. Her work is held in the collections of major institutions including the National Gallery of Australia, the Art Gallery of South Australia, Geelong Gallery, La Trobe University and international public printmaking collections in Glasgow, Chicago, Belfast and London. Green currently lives and works in Melbourne's Dandenong Ranges.

Rona Green is represented by Australian Galleries, Melbourne and Sydney, Beaver Galleries, Canberra and Solander Gallery, New Zealand.
